Public Policy Report August 6, 2018 Submitted by Denny McGuire

Local News:

The **Durham City Council** on August 6, 2018 endorsed Durham as a NC City for CEDAW. What does that mean? CEDAW is the acronym for Convention for the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination against Women, an international commitment to stop discrimination against women. AAUW NC has been a lead agency in the NC Cities for CEDAW Initiative. CEDAW is like a super ERA Amendment in that governments which endorse CEDAW not only pledge to examine their policies but also service delivery, programs, salaries, and hiring practices. Other NC communities are examining CEDAW. Where is Wake County on this issue?

State News:

- The NC General Assembly completed its work on the State Budget prior to the deadline of July 1 when the state's new fiscal year begins. Unfortunately, the General Assembly did not act on AAUW NC's priorities—expansion of Medicaid, expansion of support for public schools, passage of the Equal Rights Amendment, etc. To learn more about the Budget, go to <u>the latest special report</u> from the North Carolina Budget and Tax Center: "2019 Budget Fails to Effectively Address N.C.'s Existing and Emerging Needs: North Carolina can afford to invest in our communities as they grow and change if policymakers reject tax cuts."
- 2. A very hot election topic for the next serval months is the proposal to add **six amendments** to the North Carolina constitution. Please pay attention to this—the titles of the proposed amendments may not provide sufficient details of the intent of the amendments and their impact. Watch for much more information on this topic soon.
